God separated the light from the darkness.


"Call the light 'day', and the darkness 'night'."


There was evening and there was morning, a fourth day.

After God said, God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created man and woman He created them. God blessed them, saying


"Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and rule over it, over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air and every living creature that moves on the ground."


Dear God

And a river went out of Eden to water the garden, from there it divided and became four rivers.


The name of the rivers are these: Pison, Gihon, Hiddekel, Euphrates.

But God didn't like Adam being alone.


" It is not good for the man to be alone; He looks lonely. I will make him a helper for him"


The snake pretended to be innocent and said to her.

Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God.


Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him,

Then God shut the door of the ark.


In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, on the seventeenth day of the second month—on that day, the floodwaters came on the earth.

I know you eveen before you were born in this world. You just don't trust me and my plan. Because you are so proud. I want you to listen to my words and obey them so that my power becomes yours.



There was no destination. He was ready to settle and to leave wherever I said he would. Moreover, he always built an altar and worship me.


Just watch and learn how Abram became Abraham and follow just what he did.

"No, "we will spend the night in the outside."


But he insisted so strongly that they did go with him and entered his house. He prepared a meal for them.

"Here I am,"


"Do not lay a hand on the boy, "Don't do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son."

"I don't like them. They are not one of us but look! They are richer than us! Let's fill all the wells of them with dust."


Then Abimelech said to Isaac,


"Let's name the older Esau, the hairy one, and Jacob the grasping one."

Jacob said, "Swear to me now." So he swore to him and sold his birthright to Jacob. (Genesis 25:33)




Dear my sons and daughters!

"Hello! Shepherds, my brothers, where are you from?" "We're from Haran,"


"Do you know Laban, Nahor's grandson?"

"Jacob! My boy, you are welcomed here. It's really good to see you!"


Laban brought him to his home, and there Jacob told him all these things.

Then Laban's sons were saying,


"Jacob has taken away all that was our father's, and became rich."
